4 School Performance, Teaching and Learning:-

Maths:

Friends have provided funds for new resources. JG and FA said a huge thankyou to the Friends. Calculation policy is still under review. Each class to use the policy and create a relevant version for their year.

Early morning work focus: KS2 - times tables

KS1 - White Rose 1 minute maths

EYFS - Numberblocks.

TT Rockstars encouraged – lots of games available.

FA spoke about SATs and focus is on specific topics. Teachers in KS2 to fill gaps. Current focus is the 4 operations, Governor asked if this will be rolled out to other year groups. JG confirmed it will be.

Maths booklets used in classrooms -TA's and T's to use live marking to direct children to try reasoning questions. Governor asked is there anyway the children can continue the work in the booklet rather than stopping when they have run out of time. KH is trialling children going back to previous lesson before Teacher models the next part of the current lessons.

Assessment pre-end trackers have been introduced this year, FA to discuss with T's.

Mastering number is now used in KS1 and EYFS instead of fluency bee. FA, JD, KL and EH have been on a course and can now use in the classroom.

GP commented that year 6 were all keen and energetic today.

English

RWI Phonics – LW has assessed all children and put information in staff drive for all RWI teachers to know individual needs for the group they teach.

Wensum Hub will be delivering staff training over 2 days. Day 1 - all staff, day 2 - RWI teachers. Lots of advice given – longer lessons, sitting in a 'V' and addressing misconceptions immediately,

KS2 reading - Big reading is no more. Time now spent on reading, focussing on fluency and ability to understand. Children are split according to what stage they are at. Lessons to match need – speed sounds and improving fluency and comprehension.

72% of children have moved up reading groups within the last 2 months. Year 3 and 4 focus to move them through the groups. Identify children struggling in foundation and start addressing immediately.

Daily reading should be 20 minutes by teachers. Now moved to the end of the day. Having maths or spelling in the morning helps focus the children as they come in in the morning.

LW spoke in more detail about the Wensum Hub and the benefits for the school including advice, training and funding for resources.

Writing – pathways to write. Now introduced to school. Key focus to improve writing in the school by going back to basics. Working with Cromer Junior and Gresham Village. Files can be shared within the 3 schools using pathways to write – encourage collaboration.

Governor asked when parents listen to children read, is there any way of sharing the information given out to help them listen in the best way. Misconceptions are related more to the phonics and so impact directly on decoding. There is scope for getting the information out, but for now its about getting the children to enjoy reading, daily.

Finding the right books for children is very important. Lower ability readers shouldn't be stuck with year 1 books

New CFO started at the beginning of the academic year. September figures due imminently. GP asked why the overspend was the same at the beginning and the end. RL replied it is carried through so that the school remains neutral – the amount will stay the same, no better or worse.
